AIAA Foundation Scholarship Applications due Jan 31

The AIAA Foundation annually awards financial aid to undergraduate and graduate students in science or engineering programs enrolled in accredited colleges or universities in the US or US territories. Applicants may be students of any nationality, not restricted by the U.S. State Department, in full-time study. Scholarships range from \$500 to \$10,000.

In the past 20 years, the AIAA Foundation has provided over 1,300 scholarships and graduate awards to students at more than 150 colleges and universities worldwide, including students at Universities within the Cape Canaveral Section.

The AIAA Foundation Undergraduate Scholarships Program offers scholarships to college sophomores, juniors, and seniors each year, and recipients can apply to renew their scholarship annually until they reach graduation. There are several different undergraduate scholarships, including the Leatrice Gregory Pendray Scholarship for Female applicants. Detailed eligibility requirements are available online. For graduate student awards, applicants must have completed at least one (1) academic quarter or semester of full-time graduate-level college work and have a research topic approved.

Applications must be submitted online. Applicants must be current, dues-paying student members.

Online applications and all required transcripts must be submitted by 31 January 11:59PM EST.
