- STEM for pre-college students (Endri)
 - Sent requests for K-12 STEM project funding to our 84 Educator Associates and is forming an evaluation team. In them, we describe our new STEM grant programs for typical and for under-resourced K-12 schools.
 - Received 2 replies so far.
 - Planning to sponsor 20 proposals at \$250 each.
 - The member count per state is MA 38, ME 12, NH 27, RI 2, VT 5. Endri will send out offers to high school EAs for mentoring in coordination with Qiana.
 - We hope to increase our number of Educator Associates by 10%. Charts from the Structural Dynamic TC on their yearly STEM outreach are attached as something we could aspire to.
 - Former chair Jeffrey Mobed is assisting the team – Currently working on defining the criteria for selecting the winners...
 - Actions:
 - Qiana would like to forward the application invite to her contacts – Endri to send Qiana a copy of the email & the form.
 - Find out if we can pay forward. We believe it is OK to do so for the amount below \$600, otherwise, it can be subject to tax complications

- Mentoring (Qiana)
 - We plan to reach out again to our Educator Associates to access opportunities for mentoring to high school students. She has been in contact with Dan Cardon at Gilford High School.
 - David Guo has volunteered to give wind tunnel demos using his new tunnel lab at SNHU for this effort. See the attached close-up of the wind tunnel.
 - Qiana is planning a panel discussion with high school students – Looking for volunteers to be the panelists!
 - Actions:
 - Hiro to put the advertisement/email to recruit panelist for Qiana.
- University Outreach (Mehdi)
 - Proposal sent to 9 student branches. BU, MIT, NU, SNHU, UML, UMaine, UVt, WIT, WPI - 3 responded so far. Waiting for more
 - The invitation is now out. \$300-700 funding packages on offer for design, build & fly projects
- Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (Charlie)
 - Working on developing a relationship with the National Technical Association and the National Society of Black Engineers. These organizations may have members locally we could contact.
 - WoAA – Rosemary reached out to Krys (WPI) – She is now the liaison between AIAA-NE and WoAA.

 - Jandria Alexander, Chair of the AIAA Diversity and Inclusion Working Group was part of a zoom last July: ASCEND Webinar: Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in the Aerospace Community and Workforce, Part I which is recommended.
