

The students moved around from station to station, so out of the 28 activities that were available that night, most of them only attended about five of the activities. Participants had the choice of making straw rockets and/or foam gliders at the AIAA station. There was a steady stream of students participating in this event, and many of them showed enthusiasm on trying to make their glider or their rocket fly farther or better. Several of the students had fun learning about lift, thrust, and control surfaces and went back several times to make modifications of their designs to improve the performance of their gliders or rockets. 


