A great deal of aircraft development in America has taken place in secrecy. The U-2, SR-71 Blackbird, B-2 Spirit Bomber, and F-117 Stealth Fighter are some now high-profile examples of once hidden efforts.

The existence of these rumors, at minimum, provokes the public interest and generates lots of questions. For example, what goes on in "Area 51" and what specifically has happened or might now be happening in the secret or "black" world? What new technologies and missions are associated with the rumored planes, where are they built and based, and how many are operational? Is it actually possible to build a visually stealth airplane? Are some of the aircraft unmanned? Does the hypersonic vehicle popularly called "Aurora" really exist? There are obviously many questions, with elusive and interesting answers.


The presentation will summarize many of the rumors and review publicly available evidence that suggests the existence of secret aircraft projects. The viability of the rumors and evidence will be discussed and some additional ideas will be offered.

Background:

Dr. L. Scott Miller is a Professor and Chair of Aerospace Engineering and a National Institute for Aviation Research Fellow at Wichita State University (WZU). Scott received his Ph.D.₁ in aerospace engineering, from Texas A&M University in 1988 and began working at WSU the same year. He has been involved in various research projects and, in addition, worked summers at Boeing and NASA Langley Research Center. Active in AIAA, Scott currently serves as the ⊎SU Student Section faculty advisor and the Student Activities Committee Chairman. He has been honored as a Bombardier-Learjet Fellow (1995-98), a Dow Outstanding Young Faculty Award recipient (1994), the AIAA National Faculty Advisor Award recipient (2002), and an AIAA Outstanding Section Chairman (1999).

Approaching from the north on I-75S:
