NEW this year ... In addition to separating junior and senior divisions, each category is already assigned to a specific day AND timeslot (listed online)! We appreciate your flexibility with category preferences since we are working very hard to make sure the students have this live judging experience with all of you.

The students will be submitting a packet for judge review ahead of time. This will include their abstract, their research plan, a PowerPoint Deck, a Quad Chart (brief overview of entire project), and ISEF forms 1C and 7 (if applicable). Because of the short timeframe to talk with each student, we ask that judges review and judge the project before the live judging (other than the grading of their live presentation). This will enable the judges to have a half-hour deliberation after the live judging to select winners. We will provide a judging guide

and training video to help you better understand the judging process.
